C. Resolution 2022-35: WHEREAS, there exists a need for the following professional to serve the Village; and,

WHEREAS, funds are available for this purpose, and the Local Public Contracts Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq.) requires that the resolution authorizing the appointment without competitive bids must be publicly advertised.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Village of Loch Arbour that:

- 1. The Board of Commissioners is hereby authorized and directed to engage the services of: Licensed Professional Appraiser: Donald J. Moliver, Ph.D.

F. Resolution 2022-38: WHEREAS, National MS Society- New Jersey Metro; has requested permission to use Village streets for Bike MS: Coast the Coast fundraiser to be held on Saturday, May 7, 2022.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Village of Loch Arbour that permission is granted to National MS Society – New Jersey Metro to use Village streets for Bike MS: Coast the Coast fundraiser to be held on Saturday, May 7, 2022, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. A Certificate of Insurance naming the Village as an additional insured must be supplied to the Village on or before May1, 2022 along with a copy of the insurance policy;
- 2. All plans must be coordinated with the Borough of Deal Police Department;
- 3. Adequate personnel must be supplied to ensure the safety of bikers and pedestrians.
- 4. Traffic control devices, i.e., cones or barricades, must be supplied by National MS Society New Jersey Metro to be set-up and removed as necessary by personnel supplied by National MS Society New Jersey Metro;
- 5. Execution of the required Hold Harmless Agreement.

- **G. Resolution 2022-39:** WHEREAS, the Monmouth County Board of Chosen Freeholders, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 26:9-27 et seq. has elected through its Mosquito Control Division to perform all acts necessary for the elimination of mosquito breeding areas and/or to exterminate mosquitoes within the county; and

WHEREAS, the County has instituted an integrated Pest Management Program consisting of surveillance, water management, biological control, and chemical control to exterminate the mosquito population within the County of Monmouth; and

WHEREAS, prior to conducting aerial dispensing operation over a designated "congested area," the County is required, pursuant to Federal Aviation Administration Regulation (FAR Part 137.51), to secure prior written approval from the governing body of the political subdivision over which the aircraft is to be operated, and

WHEREAS, the Village of Loch Arbour, is designated as a "congested area" by the Federal Aviation Administration and the County has requested that this governing body consent to its proposed aerial dispensing operations.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved as follows:

- 1. The Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes the County of Monmouth Mosquito Control Division or its agent to apply pesticides by aircraft for mosquito control in certain areas of the Municipality designated by the County as being either larval mosquito habitat or areas harboring high populations or mosquitoes constituting either a nuisance, a health hazard, or both with the understanding that:
- a. The County shall utilize pesticides, application equipment and aircraft that are approved for aerial applications by the applicable Federal (USEPA) and State (NJDEP) agencies, and
- b. such operation will be performed in compliance with applicable Federal and State regulations, and
- c. the County will notify the Police Department of each municipality over which aerial pesticide operations are planned prior to commencement of such operations.

A, Next Scheduled Monthly Meeting (Regular Meeting) – Wednesday, March 2, 2022 at 6:30 pm.

- **B. Discuss Beach Lockers** Commissioner Cheswick discussed the purchase of an additional 8 lockers for the 2022 Beach Season. Commissioner Cheswick reported due to increased costs of supplies, each locker would cost \$1,495. The total cost is \$11,960. The Mayor and Commissioners discussed and decided to table the matter at this time.
- **C. Beach Replenishment** Mayor Fernicola reported heavy machinery is still being stored on the Village Beach. The contractor is having rocks (boulders) delivered and then driving the rocks down the beach to the work area in Deal. Mayor Fernicola is making every effort to have them move all machinery and equipment off the Village, as the beach replenishment in Loch Arbour has been completed for several weeks ago.
- **D. Discuss Potential Hedge Ordinance** The Clerk summarized the Ordinances from Deal, Allenhurst and Interlaken. The Mayor and Commissioners discussed with the Village Zoning Officer. After considerable discussion, the Mayor and Commissioners decided to table the matter at this time. The Zoning Officer also recommended adopting a Shade Tree Ordinance.

Melanie Nowlin, Edgemont Drive, discussed the potential hedge ordinance and she is in favor of adopting a hedge ordinance. Ms. Nowlin is in favor of adopting a Tree Ordinance. She discussed the flooding has increased, due to how many trees are being removed around town.

Remo Maisto, Elberon Avenue, is in favor adopting a hedge ordinance. Mr. Maisto discussed hedges blocking the ocean view on Elberon Avenue and Ocean Place. Mr. Maisto commented about a property in Allenhurst.

There being no further comments, and UPON MOTION of Mayor Fernicola, seconded by Commissioner Cheswick, carried, the public hearing be closed.
