# **ORDINANCE 2018-437**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 156 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING LAND USE DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS AND RESTRICTIONS

PURSUANT TO THE MINICIPAL LAND USE LAW (CHAPTER 291, P.L. 1975);
ESTABLISHING A ZONING BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT AND PLANNING BOARD
PURSUANT TO SAID LAW; AND REPEALING ALL PRIOR ORDINANCES
RELATING TO ZONING AND PLANNING, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR
THE VIOLATION OF THE TERMS AND PROVISIONS THEREOF IN THE VILLAGE
OF LOCH ARBOUR, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY"
SO AS TO CONFORM WITH THE MASTER PLAN OF THE VILLAGE OF LOCH
ARBOUR

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Village of Loch Arbour, in the County of Monmouth and the State of New Jersey, that the Ordinance referred to in the title hereof is amended and supplemented as follows:

Section 1. Section 705 of Article 7, "C" Commercial, is hereby amended to read as follows:

A. Principal Permitted Use on Land and in Buildings

Office buildings and banks; churches or other places of worship; car wash; tavern; restaurant for sit-down dinners only and with no drive-in facilities; and retail businesses.

Section 2. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances which are inconsistent herewith are repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law.

# ORDINANCE NO. 2018-438 AN ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE CALENDAR YEAR 2018 MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14)

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Commissioners of the Village of Loch Arbour as follows:

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.1, et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Village of Loch Arbour in the County of Monmouth finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2018 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of its citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for the said year, amounting to \$10,453.49 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Village of Loch Arbour, in the County of Monmouth, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2018 budget year, the final appropriations of the Village of Loch Arbour shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$10,453.49 and that the CY 2018 municipal budget for the Village of Loch Arbour be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that a certified copy of this ordinance, upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

Rich from Mr. Hulsart's office explained the proposed Ordinance.

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-78b has authorized the Local Finance Board to adopt rules that permit municipalities in sound fiscal condition to assume the responsibility, normally granted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, of conducting the annual budget examination; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 5:30-7 was adopted by the Local Finance Board on February 11, 1997; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.2 through 7.5, the *Village of Loch Arbour* has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local government Services, and the

Chief Financial officer has determined that the local government meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2018 budget year.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the Village of Loch Arbour that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a & 7.6b and based upon the Chief Financial Officer's certification, the governing body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

- 1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to law and appropriated as such in the budget:
  - a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
  - b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
  - c. Cash deficit of preceding year
  - d. Reserve for uncollected taxes
  - e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
  - f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes.
- 2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.3 et seq., are fully met (complies with CAP law).
- 3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and N.J.A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.
  - 4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
    - a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate and correctly stated,
    - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth
    - c. In itemization, form, arrangement and content, the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.
- 5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced and publicly advertised in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
  - 6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution will be forwarded to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services upon adoption.

"The main bathing area of the beachfront shall be between the area beginning approximately ten feet north of the old wooden groin located at the end of Euclid Ave, and ending approximately ten feet south of the small jetty at the end of Elberon Ave. These areas will be marked with a line drop and buoys marking the perimeter of the designated bathing area. The South Beach bathing area shall be located approximately ten feet south of the old wooden groin located at the end of Euclid Ave and extend to approximately ten feet north of the new Loch Arbour/Kassin Beach border. The northern perimeter of this bathing area shall be marked with a rope drop and buoys. The southern perimeter will be marked with either a rope drop and buoys or flag. Bathing and/or the use of floatable recreational devices shall be permitted in these areas only at the discretion of the beach manager, based upon weather, ocean and crowd conditions."

WHEREAS, such a resolution should designate the individual authorized to ensure the application is properly completed and timely filed.
