AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING ORDINANCE #156 KNOWN AS "THE LOCH ARBOUR LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS ORDINANCE."

BE IT ORDAINED, By the Board of Trustees of the Village of Loch Arbour, County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey that Ordinance #156, "THE LOCH ARBOUR LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

PURPOSE: The New Jersey Statewide Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act (P.L. 1987, c.102) requires that municipal development regulations include provisions for the collection, proposal for 50 or more single family units, 25 or more multifamily units or any commercial or industrial development proposal utilizing 1000 or more square feet of land.

SECTION 1: Article 611 PUBLIC USE AND SERVICE AREAS shall be amended to include the following new Section D.

- D. Materials designated in the Village of Loch Arbour Recycling Ordinance #212 shall be separated from other solid waste by shall be provided as follows:
- 1. For each subdivision application, the applicant shall provide a storage area of at least 3 square feet within each dwelling unit to accomodate a one week accumulation of mandated bottles, (including but not limited to: newspaper, glass area may be located in the laundry room, garage, basement, basis from each dwelling unit, one or more common storage development.
- 2. For each site plan application for commercial and industrial developments that utilize 1000 square feet or more of land, the applicant shall provide the Municipal Agency with estimates of the quantity of mandated recyclable materials (including tin and bi-metal cans, high grade paper, and corrugated each week. A separated storage area must be provided to material. The Municipal Agency may require the location of the development.

SECTION 2: Severability. If any section, subsection, clause or phrase of this ordinance is held unconstitutional or invalid portions of this ordinance.

SECTION 3: Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 4: When effective. This Ordinance, when finally passed and published according to law, shall take effect immediately.
