AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 196 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING LAND USE DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS AND RESTRICTIONS PURSUANT TO THE MUNICIPAL LAND USE LAW (CHAPTER 291, P.L. 1975); ESTABLISHING A ZONING BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT AND PLANNING BOARD PURSUANT TO SAID LAW; AND REPEALING ALL PRIOR ORDINANCES RELATING TO ZONING AND PLANNING, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE TERMS AND PROVISIONS THEREOF IN THE VILLAGE OF LOCH ARBOUR, COUNTY OF MONMOUTH AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY" SO AS TO ESTABLISH AN OFFICE-PROFESSIONAL ZONE IN THE VILLAGE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LOCH ARBOUR, that the Ordinances referred to in the title hereof are

Section 1. ORDINANCE NO. 196, SECTION 3. SUBSECTION G (1):
ORDINANCE NO. 156, ARTICLE 7. (ZONING DISTRICTS AND ZONING MAP). SECTION 706 "OP" OFFICE-PROFESSIONAL is amended to read as follows:

1. One sign having a maximum size of 16 square feet may be maintained. Maximum height of the permitted sign is limited to four (4) feet from the ground to the top of the sign. Said sign may be located in the grass median between sidewalk and parking lot at the midline of the property. Illumination of said sign is

Section 2. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistency. All other parts of Ordinance No. 156 and Ordinance No. 196 not inconsistent herewith are hereby ratified and

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law.
